Re: Practice of Pharmacy into Nevada

Executive Secretary Wuest:

NRS 639.100(1)(a), as amended by Senate Bill 408, now states in pertinent part that it is "unlawful for any person to dispense¹ or compound² any prescription of a practitioner, unless the person holds the appropriate certificate, license or permit required by this chapter or chapter 453 or 454 of NRS." NRS 639.100(1)(a) operates in conjunction with NRS 453.371(2),³ NRS 453.377(1),⁴ NRS 454.215(1),⁵ NRS 639.015,⁶ and NRS 639.284(2),⁷ to require any pharmacist compounding or dispensing any prescription for a controlled substance or dangerous drug for a patient located in Nevada to be registered with the Board.⁸
